• A Sister was part of the crew that built scaffolding for the Canadian Pacific Women's Open (CPWO) in Saskatchewan.



In the **Central South Regional Council SIB Committee**, Sisters held education meetings with apprentices to provide information about ways to succeed on the job and at the UBC.

Sisters also participated in the Pasadena School District "fill the bus" campaign. This is an annual event where school supplies are collected for students.

The **Michigan Regional Council SIB Committee** currently has 83 members, with 12 serving as mentors. They have been actively recruiting, mentoring, and educating members. Consider these examples:

- Implementing goals to help the UBC and the Council. This is the focus of 19 Sisters who returned from the 2018 Sisters Conference energized and excited.
- Planning for educational opportunities at two new training centers scheduled for completion in 2019 one in Negaunee and one in Wayland.
- Developing a package to ensure that new apprentices will have consistent information.
- Supporting Gretchen Whitmer for Governor, as well as campaigning for other pro-Union candidates.
- Battling right-to-work and anti-Union government officials.

Their guest speaker was a contractor member who discussed the apprentice program; specifically emphasizing the role that continued training played in keeping a highly-skilled workforce, securing work for contractors, and securing jobs for workers.

In the **St. Louis & Kansas City Regional Council SIB Committee**, Sisters saw the positive impact of their many months of campaigning to defeat right-to-work legislation, with the latest initiative being to get a NO Vote on Proposition A. Over 800,000 Missouri residents were engaged during the campaign. But most importantly, working Missourians showed up at the polls, which led to success – the Vote was 67%-NO, 33%-YES!
